The workshop is one of a continuing series following on from the publication of the highly-acclaimed *Woodland Heritage Manual* and stemming from 25 years of leading research in this field. The manual was the result of a Heritage Lottery funded project in collaboration with the Woodland Trust, The Forestry Commission and English Heritage to provide information to volunteer groups, individuals and professionals about researching wooded landscapes. Come along and find out more. Events suited to all from beginners and keen volunteers to seasoned professionals and academics.

This workshop '**Reading the Wooded Landscape**' will provide an introduction to woodland history and biological indicators in relation to understanding the wooded landscape. It will give practical examples of survey methods for gathering information on ancient woodland indicators, with an emphasis on woodland ferns & fungi, and how people can use them within their local woodland. Tutors for the day will be Paul Ardron (Biodiversity & Landscape History Research Institute) and Barry Wright (Sheffield Hallam University).

The workshop will run from 9.45am (registration) to 4.30pm; refreshments and lunch included.

The morning will be a series of introductory talks on the use of botanical indicators in ancient woodlands and on recognising and identifying woodland ferns & fungi. After lunch there will be a field visit, lasting about two hours (bring stout footwear and wet weather gear), which will look at the practical applications of the information from the morning sessions. The day will finish with a summary and discussion of the lessons learnt from the field visit.

The day is suitable for everyone who has an interest in and would like to learn more about woodland botanical indicators, ferns and fungi.
